On Prayer 90 Call to Prayer (Part Three)

The key to answered prayer is seen in Yeshua's discourse on the true (real) vine of John chapter 15: "I am the true vine, and my father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. Already you are clean through the word I have spoken to you. Abide (remain) in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides (remains) in the vine, neither can you unless you abide (remain) in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, it is he that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide (remain) in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire and burned. If you abide in me and my words abide (remain) in you, ask what ever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:1-7 ESV).

Please do not miss how the Lord emphasizes his words abiding in us (remaining in our hearts) as a prerequisite to answered prayer (If you abide in me and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish and it will be done for you). We cannot overemphasize this truth. It is absolutely essential for effective prayer. **We must program ourselves to abide in Messiah and to have his words abide in us.**

All Lives Matter (Part Two)

Battlefield News Note: In the October Issue we published a letter from an incarcerated brother in Christ. The following is the second part of a teaching he presented to other believing inmates at Walker State Prison.

We all know God is love (I John 4:8) and merciful, gracious and kind toward mankind even after its fall with Adam and Khawaw (Eve). He tells us this and has shown us throughout the ages.

Ps 145:9 says, "The Lord is good to all and his tender mercies are over all his works" (KJV).

Rom 5:8 says, "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (NIV)

John 3:16-17 says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through him might be saved" (NKJV)

Acts 10:34-35 says, "Then Kefa (Peter) addressed them: 'I now understand that God does not play favorites, but that whoever fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him, no matter what people he belongs to'" (CJB).

Let's look at the parable of the "good Samaritan."

"And behold, a lawyer stood up to put him (Yeshua) to the test, saying, 'Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?' He (Jesus) said to him (the lawyer), 'What is written in the law?' What is your reading of it?' And he (the lawyer) answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.' And he (the Lord) said to him (the lawyer), 'You have answered correctly; do this and you will live.'

But he (the lawyer), desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him (the injured man), he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him (the injured man), passed by

on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he (the injured man) was, and when he (the Samaritan) saw him, he had compassion. He (the Samaritan) went to him (the injured man) and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him (injured man) on his (Samaritan) own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him. And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the inn keeper, saying, "take care of him and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back." Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers? He (the lawyer) said, "The one who showed him mercy." And Jesus said to him, "You go, and do likewise" (Luke 10:25-37 ESV).

Now in the parable we see a human being that's been robbed, beaten and left for dead. Some passed by without helping or even acknowledging the man. We know this because they walked on the other side of the road. Can you imagine what it is like to be down and in a really bad situation like this man and no one cares enough to stop even to help save your life? Most people would not want to be left for dead I believe we all would hope to have a Good Samaritan on deck in a crisis of this nature. In Mark 12: 29-31, when Jesus was asked the greatest commandment, he answered, "'Sh'mah (hear - Deut 6:4) oh Israel, the Lord your God is one God. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these" (NAB). No matter the race, color or religion of someone, I would hope that we all would operate in the spirit the Great Commandment speaks about.

Is there Enough Evidence?

If it were illegal, could you be convicted of it? Is there enough evidence against you for you to be convicted? We have all heard stories about people who go to church and consider themselves to be Christians, but outside church, no one would suspect they were Christians. A friend once asked me if there was enough evidence to convict me of being a Christian. I had never heard it put that way before, but it made me become very honest with myself. Was there enough evidence?

"We have all seen that being in unity, real unity, being and acting like we are all one body – the body of Christ – is what the Lord wants, prayed for and has told us to accomplish. The rest of the Christian World do not seem to know this, but we in the Whole Body of Christ Alliance know it well. We have been saying it to each other since 2010.

I want to ask all of you in the same way it was presented to me: if working to unite the body of Christ were illegal, let us say a capital crime, would there be enough evidence to convict you of it? Is there enough evidence to convict any of us of it? When I am honest with myself, I must answer a "no" to this question, almost every one of us must answer the question in the same way. I thank and praise God that not everyone in this alliance, however, can answer this question in the negative. If I used the fingers of both hands, however, I could count those that would definitely have to hire a defense attorney because they have been caught red-handed working to unite the body of Christ.

I am the pastor of a church, work a full-time job, I serve on the board of directors of the WBCA, am a husband and a father, and more. I am quite busy. I say this because, undoubtedly, there are those that would answer that they are too busy to actually do the work that must be done to unite the body. I promise you, you are not busier than I. I have actually heard one pastor say, "We are united." Look around you, people. It does not require a genius to see that that statement is a lie.

I have decided to make a commitment. I have decided to endeavor to create the evidence against myself. I want there to be enough evidence to convict me of working to bring about unity in the body of Christ. After all, that is one of the requirements for being part of the alliance – that we be willing to do the work to bring this about. I am making the commitment to actually do the work; not just talk about it. If doing the work becomes a capital crime, I want there to be enough evidence to convict me.

This is the part where I ask you to put your action where your mouth is and make this commitment with me. It does not matter if you do not know how (I don't really believe that anyway), I am going to tell you all you need to know, but you will have to get up off the couch, you will have to turn off the television, you will have to get up off your pew and actually take action – You!

There are many who speak in public of things and people, and say, "I'm not going to name any names..." Well, I have a reputation, along with Pastor Michael Smith and a very few others of naming names. I am about to do that now. I am going to volunteer the entire board of directors, including myself to be available to you to tell you what you can do. If you do not know what to do, one of these people will help you, but you must actually pick up the telephone and call one of us.

"In 2018 the children's choir sang at a trucking company which was also a street ministry. I thought, 'Why, Lord?' Fast forward: In 2020 we were trying to open a hospital in Haiti. We needed to ship medical supplies, which meant we needed a shipping container. I could not get any of that together. My assistant, Lisa Welshman, said, 'What about Jody? She has a trucking company right?'"
"I called Jody and asked her if it was something that was even possible for her to do. She said, 'Yes.'"

"I said yes because that's what we do. We usually ship heavy equipment overseas, shipping a container of medical supplies would be a piece of cake. One thing I did know was that the Lord had already orchestrated it."

It was really quite amazing how quickly the shipping container arrived in Haiti, especially considering it all happened during the Covid and everything. They were able to get the hospital done sooner. We had a lot of opposition, but when we got out of there, the feeling that we had when we heard was fantastic. All of us in the office jumped up and down. We were very excited. We get excited about some completed deliveries, but we don't ever get that excited."



“I got into a tussle with my sister a while back and I made the statement, ‘I don’t need her.’ My mother told me, ‘You can’t just throw people away.’

“In the body of Christ we do that all the time. We are so quick to sever relationships. When our world views don’t match up (and sooner or later they won’t), we discard each other. This is so deeply saddening to our Messiah. Disagreement and conflict without the glue of peace can become strife, then alienation. We can change a brother into a stranger.

Worship goes on



Pastor Mary Tate of House of Hope spoke on unity in the body of Christ.

“Illustrations of this are always bad examples, but look at what happened in Rwanda in the 90s between the Hutus and the Tutsis. They were the same race, but they were put against each other and between 500 and 800 thousand Tutsis were murdered while the local media fanned the flames. The same thing happened in Nazi Germany.

“When someone is on their death bed, they’re not concerned about their possessions, but their legacy, people they spent their life investing in. In Gen 15:12-16, God told Abram his descendants would go through some things, but he told Abram he would have shalom (peace). There was contention between brothers: Yitzchak (Isaac) and Yishma’el (Ishmael), between Ya’akov (Jacob) and Esav (Esau). There was contention between Leah and Rachel as well as 11 brothers and Yosef (Joseph). Did Abraham do it differently? Yes, Abraham split with Lot in a contentious situation, but chose peace, and so God rewarded him with peace. In Gen 13:8 they parted peacefully.

We believe that there are eight principles that must be considered when establishing sound doctrine and criterion for unity. There may be a few more, but definitely not less nor significantly more, other wise we border on works of the law, rather than works of faith. They are:

- 1: Humans are born with a sin nature; all have sinned and without Christ, are worthy of hell, not fit for heaven.
- 2: Yeshua (Jesus) is the messiah, the spotless Lamb of God, and in fact, is God himself, the second member of the Godhead, not a second God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
- 3: Christ the Messiah was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of a virgin (Miriam also called Mary, and sinless.
- 4: Jesus (Yeshua) died on the cross for your sins and mine.
- 5: Almighty God the Father raised Messiah (Jesus) from the dead on the third day.
- 6: Christ will return for his bride at the appointed time of the Father.
- 7: The Holy Bible is completely trustworthy, for it is inspired by the Holy Spirit.
- 8: Blatant sin (living in sin) is intolerable and the Community of Messiah (Church) must not tolerate it from its own.

"In Mal 2:10 the prophet says we have been faithless to one another and profaned the covenant. We are supposed to be the people of the covenant. Abraham understood the connection between the covenant and the power of strife within the brotherhood. Without the bond of peace, there is no blessing.

"In Eph 4:3 we have seen the phrase, 'unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.' In Greek the word is 'sundesmos' (soon-dess-mos), Ligament, uniting principle, control, bond; also Sundaos(soon-dah-oh), bond, as in bondage. Paul talked about being a prisoner of the Lord. He's talking about being chained together. When Paul says we should 'preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace,' he is saying that the Ruakh Hakodesh (Holy Spirit) is the chain by which we are bound together as one people (am ehad), serving the Lord faithfully. We divide the unity of the Lord when we are in disunity.

We break those bonds of peace when we declare with our words, actions, thoughts or feelings that we don't want to be bound together with our brothers and sisters in unity.

“Deut 32:30 talks about one chasing a thousand and two chasing 2000. Right? No, one chases a thousand and two put 10,000 to flight. The Spirit of God is a spirit of multiplication. When two people are bound together with one purpose, they can accomplish ten-fold for the Kingdom of Heaven. The devil knows this. That’s why he works to decrease unity.

“If we are not seeing the results we wanna see, but just running in place, maybe somewhere along the way we broke the bond of peace, maybe got nit-picky. The definition of success must be what the Lord says, not what man says it is. Forget the mega-church mindset. Pastors and leaders sometimes treat their church like that. They may have a need for control (‘I wanna do it my way’) or power (‘This is my house; I’ll do as I please’), or autonomy (‘I can do this myself’), or self-importance (‘If you want something done right...’). When this happens, our need for control, power, autonomy and self-importance has overshadowed our willingness to share, serve alongside and enjoin ourselves to others. When our arrogance outweighs God’s fruitfulness in the spirit of multiplication, we are out of order.

“I am not saying we should link arms with idol-worshippers, but that we should ‘come and reason together.’ We need to respond to one another with words dipped in honey. This is a Deborah anointing. She did not rule with an iron fist. Her words were dipped in honey because the Lord wants to be able to say, ‘Taste and see that the Lord is good.’

“Never deliver a message that God has not spoken to your heart. The church would be so much easier if we didn’t have to deal with people. Right? God placed people in our lives. “The Corinthians felt so advanced that they began to judge the wise and the unwise, as well as the gifted. That was a problem.

“There are eight things we can do to put unity back into the body:

1: Eph 4:2, unity requires humility. We must be willing to sacrifice our ego for others.

2: We must be gentle. A gentle person has the ability to deal with chaos. It’s easier to just leave a church and start your own church. Many churches are begun out of rebellion.

3: We must be patient with each other.

4: We must be understanding, but not ignore the situation – balancing. Rom 5:20, people who are sinful will let you down because they have not gained enough integrity. What kind of people of God are we if our brother sins and we say nothing? We can say, ‘You don’t have to do that.’ You can make all kinds of appointments and cancel them, but there is one appointment with the judgment of the Lord that you cannot cancel.

5: Don’t expect perfection out of your church family. There are people there that you may not want to be around, but everyone is at a different level of maturity. Even at the gas station you have three levels of gas quality. Look at Eph 4:4.

6: We should celebrate. We should each not only use the gifts God has given us to minister to the other members of the body, but we should celebrate the special gifts God has given others.

7: We must follow those with leadership gifts. Eph 4:11 says, ‘He gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers’ (NAB). They are responsible for building up the ministry, the church, the community of Messiah, which includes working for unity in the body of Christ. Why would you follow a leader that does not follow Christ, does not work for unity?

8: We must speak the truth in love. You are growing to be more and more like Christ every day. When you say it, say it out of love, not agitation.

“God helps us grow and we must endeavor to keep the unity of the church. People accomplish far more together than they do when they are competing with one another. Satan is not out there drinking and smoking weed on Saturday and Sunday; he’s in church. Satan is not our friend. We do not want to make him happy because of our stupidity. There are many churches that can’t open because of what is going on. We have one another’s backs.”

Your mama could be a prostitute and your daddy a drug addict, but it doesn’t matter because you have Jesus. We are on the same team. There is no room for, no time for division in the body of Christ. 




